

December 16 Sermon—Human Rights

Next Sunday, the 10am service will commemorate 70 years since the Universal Declaration of Human Rights was ratified and signed as a United Nations charter to identify human rights such as all are born free, all are equal before the law, and the right to asylum. The sermon will be shared by Archdeacon Alan Nichols, who will tell stories of his refugee work in Africa and South East Asia, and Grant MacKenzie, lawyer and member of St Michael's.
