



Contemplative Prayer

Connecting mind, body and soul with God

“Surrender your anxiety. Be still and realise that I am God”

Psalm 46:10

Preparation

Settle where you are comfortable

Notice where there is tension in your body and gently relax each muscle group.

You may wish to close your eyes and hold your hands out in a position of openness.

Take a few slow, deep breaths allowing your mind and body to become present and at ease.

Music

You may wish to listen to a song to assist in settling your mind, body and soul.

Before the prayers, I suggest listening now to ‘The Deer’s Cry’ sung by *Lisa Kelly*. (Also known as St Patrick’s Breastplate).

At the end of the session, I suggest the hymn, ‘Nearer my God to Thee’, sung by *Salt of the Sound*.

Prayers

From a place of being held and known by God who fills us with love and care, who is beside, behind and before us, who is with us as we rise, sit and go out. It is from this place of knowledge and certainty, that we enter a time of intercessory prayer.

World

Let us pray for the world.

For those tending to the wounded in makeshift tents as heavy rain sweeps through
We pray for vital medicines, bandages and equipment to be restocked quickly,
For your grace and mercy to sweep through and heal

Myanmar

We pray for the people of Myanmar who are suffering the overwhelming spread of the delta variant of Covid as well as the impact on daily life from the military coup.
We pray for friends in the Anglican Church known to us.
We pray for the leadership of Archbishop Stephen Than Myint Oo as he leads the church response to sustain those who are ill or in grief following the death of so many church members.
