We are welcoming people back to Sunday Services

No invitation to attend church required!

- Those attending must show proof of receiving two approved vaccines for Covid-19 when checking in.
- For those not able to attend in person, we still offer real time participation via our livestream on Facebook or YouTube.
- Total number indoors is restricted to 100 by the **4sqm density rule** set by the State Govt.
- Other meetings of fully vaccinated people can occur on site during the week with up to 20 people indoors, but must be booked with the vicar or churchwardens and have a Covid-safety officer appointed.
- When indoors, **face masks** must be worn at all times (including children from Grade 3 school age upwards).
- For 10am Sunday services, Kids Church returns for pre-school to early Primary School ages with our team of Kids Church leaders coordinated by Dianne Shay.
- Mid-week activities onsite are soon resuming including hire-groups, playgroup and other meetings.
