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		 Anne W highlighted the following to the meeting: A key focus was on the development of a Midweek Ministry. This was placed on hold with the change of ministers but will be high on the agenda going forward. The Easter Art installation on the front lawn was enjoyed by many and provoked many meaningful interactions. Commitment to reconciliation and the "listening to the heart" group. Support for Kim M and the campaign she is managing in relation to preventing violence against women. 	
		 Q&A: Q: Dianne S asked what considerations had been made regarding the change in Land Tax rules by the state government. A: This is a matter ultimately for the Wardens. We are aware of the changes and their full implication is under investigation and will be known post AGM. Because we hire William's Hall there will be a % of the church property that will be liable to Land Tax and will be determined by fair calculation once the detail is known. 	Action Wardens

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


f.	Finance	Last year we forecast income would not meet expenses, but the loss could be covered by our cash reserves. The gap turned out to be less than anticipated with income being 6% above budget and expenditure being 10% under budget, resulting in a net loss of \$9K. We hold \$114K in cash reserves and have a liability of 20K (payments to Steve from his benefits account, payments to staff, upcoming month expenditure). We have been notified that our finances have been audited and completed today.	
		 Q&A: Q. Barb W asked for a breakdown of and more detail on the cash reserves. A: We will get back with details such as the piano fund, ADF fund, interest, trading accounts, and so on. 	Action Wardens in lieu of no Treasurer
g.	Budget	 Next year's budget was prepared with Steve with the following assumptions: Income is the same as 2023. No full-time vicar until Easter thus so expense lower than normal. No increase in hall hire income. An allowance for Kim's ongoing work at 3 days per week, and additional hours for Rhonda E in the office. 	
		The budget will be reviewed with the incoming Parish Council. Q&A: Q. John S asked about renovation allocations. A. We have allowed 40K remedial for works to the vicarage. Q. Janette A asked about our commitment to the Common Grace partnership. This is urgent as it is now finished and lapsed.
